

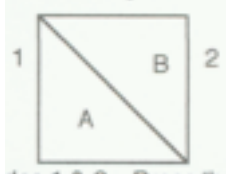
Continuous Bias

1. Cut fabric into a square. (ie 45" fabric, buy 1-1/4 yard to have a 45" square)

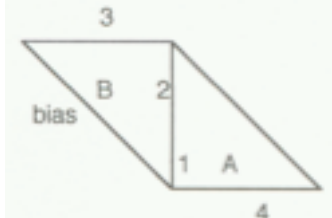


A 36" square will give you 10 yards of 3" bias
A 45' square will give you 16 yards of 3" bias.

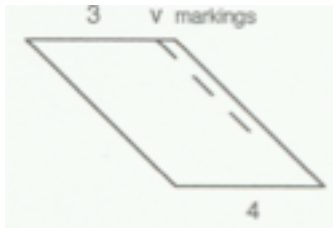
2. Cut the square diagonally into 2 triangles A & B with sides 1 and 2.



3. Sew together sides 1 and 2. Press seam to the side.



4. Fold over each triangle only on itself. This creates a tube, but we want a spiral so we have to off-set by the measurement of the width of the bias you are cutting. Mark the width of your bias strip along the bias edge for about 6".



5. Stitch the straight of grain edges together off-set by the width of your bias



6. Using a small cutting board and rotary cutter, put the board inside the tube and rotate the fabric tube around as you cut your continuous bias.
